Daeun Han began studying piano at the age of three and quickly distinguished herself through numerous competition awards during her childhood in South Korea. She received her early musical training at Yewon School and Seoul Arts High School, where she developed a strong foundation in piano performance and musical interpretation.

She earned her Bachelor of Music in Piano Performance from Seoul National University, graduating cum laude under the guidance of Ian Hobson. She continued her studies at the Indiana University Jacobs School of Music, where she completed both a Master of Music degree and an Artist Diploma under Norman Krieger.

Daeun has earned recognition in several prestigious competitions, including the Grand Prize at the Young Texas Artists Music Competition, First Prize at the Indiana Chapter of the National Society of Arts and Letters Instrumental Music Competition, and awards from the Memphis International Piano Competition and the Rose Petroff Foundation Piano Competition.

In addition to her performing career, Daeun is an active educator. She has served on the faculty of the Young Pianist Program at Indiana University and has taught at Lone Star Music Academy and the Music Institute of North Texas. She also participated in the Distance Teaching and Learning Lab's Cheerful Heart Project, providing online piano instruction to students in the Dominican Republic.

Daeun is currently pursuing a Doctor of Musical Arts degree at the University of North Texas under Pamela Mia Paul, where she also serves as a teaching fellow, teaching both group piano and private lessons.
