The **Frieden Quartet** features four talented musicians from Indonesia, Alaska, and Texas. As part of the new highly competitive Undergraduate String Quartet Program at the University of North Texas, each member was selected from a pool of applicants to join the fully-funded quartet for four years. The quartet was recently selected as the Fellowship Quartet for the Anchorage Chamber Music Festival and has participated in masterclasses led by the Verona Quartet, New Zealand Quartet, and Annie Fullard of the Cavani String Quartet. The quartet also recently placed as a finalist in the national Coltman Chamber Music Competition and the Music Teachers National

Association (MTNA) Competition. At the University of North Texas, they work with esteemed faculty Nikola Ruzevic, Julia Bushkova, and have worked with the late Eugene Osadchy.

**Charlie Latimer** is pursuing his bachelor's degree in violin performance at the University of North Texas under Julia Bushkova. Charlie has won several competitions including the Alaska Youth Symphony, Anchorage Civic Orchestra, and Anchorage Chamber Music Festival Concerto Competitions. Quartet music is Charlie's greatest passion. He plays first violin in the Frieden Quartet.

**Clarissa Tamara** is a violinist from Indonesia. She has performed in several countries in Asia including Japan, Singapore, and Malaysia. Currently, Clarissa is pursuing a bachelor's degree in violin performance at the University of North Texas under Julia Bushkova. Clarissa received a full-tuition scholarship through the Undergraduate String Quartet Program at the University of North Texas. This brought Clarissa to the U.S. where she now plays second violin in the Frieden Quartet.

**Patrick Hayes** is a junior at the University of North Texas pursuing a degree in viola performance under Dr. Susan Dubois. He is local to Texas, growing up in nearby Plano. He is a recipient of the Undergraduate String Quartet Scholarship.

**Alexander Paradis** is a cellist from McKinney, Texas, studying music performance at the University of North Texas, formerly under the late Eugene Osadchy and currently with Ross Gasworth. He has played in orchestras such as the TMEA All-State Symphony Orchestra, Monroe Symphony Orchestra, and the McKinney Philharmonic Orchestra. Alexander is a recipient of the Undergraduate String Quartet Scholarship and is the cellist in the Frieden Quartet.

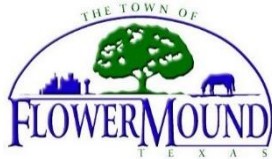
