The 2026 Vernell Gregg Young Artists Competition will consist of two rounds. For the preliminary round, contestants will submit a YouTube video of at least one movement from their chosen concerto. The final round will be conducted live before a panel of judges and must include the complete concerto (all movements) with second piano accompaniment. Performance with the Symphony

• The Grand Prize Winner will perform with the Lewisville Lake Symphony on Aoril 10, 2026.

Awards

• Grand Prize: One winner will perform with the Lewisville Lake Symphony at the April 10, 2026 concert and will receive the \$1,000 Bill and Grace Lawrence Scholarship.

- The Grand Prize winner may be either a junior or senior entrant.
- Place Winners: First, second, third and honorable mention winners may be named in both divisions.
- The judges will designate a Grand Prize winner only if they deem the contestant worthy.
 If no entrant meets acceptable standards, no winner will be declared. The decision of the judges will be final.

• The symphony will not pay transportation or housing expenses for the Live Final Round or the April 10 symphony performance.

HOW TO APPLY

Preliminary Round

- Upload a high-quality YouTube video (audio+video) of at least one movement of a concerto from the approved repertory list (see Repertoire below).
- The video selections must be accompanied by either piano or orchestra.
- Contestants who are currently studying with any of the judges may not apply.
- Orchestral tutti cuts are permitted.
- The video must have been made during 2025, not before.
- The video must show the hands and face of the contestant.
- The video must be continuous and unedited, except for breaks between movements.
- The contestant must play from memory.

Final Round (Saturday, January 17, 2026)

- Finalists will perform before a panel of distinguished judges at Trinity Presbyterian Church in Flower Mound, Texas, on Saturday, January 17, 2026).
- Contestants must perform the entire concerto.
- Contestants must play from memory.
- The concerto must be accompanied by piano.
- The winner will be announced on January 17 after deliberations by the judges. The decision of the judges is final.
